





WHAT DO GOOD READERS DO WHEN THEY READ?







Constantly evaluate the text.

Look over text before they read.

Identify the most relevant sections.

GOOD READERS

Integrate prior knowledge.

Make predictions about what is to come.

Monitor the understanding of the text.







Look for unknown vocabulary.

Read different kinds of texts differently.

Active readers.

GOOD READERS

Make decisions about what to read carefully, what to read quickly, what not to read, and what to reread.

PARAPHRASING

When you paraphrase, you restate someone else's ideas in your own words.



The usual purpose of a paraphrase is to express someone else's ideas more clearly and more simply.







WHY PARAPHRASING?

It aids comprehension.

It helps to retain information longer in our memory. It exercises our critical thinking.







STEPS OF PARAPHRASING



Read the original until you fully understand it.

Paraphrase without looking into the original.



Keep the main idea of the text.

EXAMPLE

Original text:

Differentiation as an instructional approach promotes a balance between a student's style and a student's ability. Differentiated instruction provides the student with options for processing and internalizing the content, and for constructing new learning in order to progress academically.

Incorrect paraphrasing:

Differentiation is a <u>way</u> to <u>encourage equality</u> between the <u>approach and talent of the student</u> (Thompson, 2009). <u>This type of instruction gives</u> students different <u>ways</u> to deal with and <u>grasp information</u>, and for <u>establishing</u> new learning <u>to move</u> on in <u>education</u> (Thompson, 2009).









EXAMPLE

Original text:

Differentiation as an instructional approach promotes a balance between a student's style and a student's ability. Differentiated instruction provides the student with options for processing and internalizing the content, and for constructing new learning in order to progress academically.

Correct paraphrasing:

Teachers use differentiated instruction to help students learn, allowing the teacher to cater lessons to the way each student learns and each student's skill (Thompson, 2009).

Essential ideas and info taken from the text.

Unique word choice and sentence structure.







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SUMMARY

A summary is a condensed version of a larger reading. A summary is not a rewrite of the original text.

When writing a summary, use your own words to express briefly the main idea and relevant details of the text.







REMEMBER!



It restates ONLY the main points of a text.



It does not have to be long, nor should it be short.



Do not write the original piece of text.

Do not include your opinion unless it is required





SUMMARIZING

- Change the sentence structure of the original text.
 - Change the vocabulary of the original text.
- Use all the details in the original text.
- A paraphrase is often a similar length as the original.

- Use only the most important ideas in the original text.
- A summary is significantly shorter than the original.



HOW TO SUMMARIZE



Step 3 From the key points, identify and write down:

- the shared language (obese, children).
- details from the original using different words (increase, cause problems, medical services).




Step 4 Using only the words and phrases in your notes, write your summary. Do not look at the original text.

HOW TO SUMMARIZE



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Step 5 Compare your summary with the original text. Check the following:

- Does the summary use different vocabulary?
- Does the summary have a different sentence structure?
- Does the summary include only key points? (The summary should not include specific details, statistics, or examples.)
- Does the summary avoid using more than three words in a row from the original?



Step 6 Revise your summary as necessary.

FINAL SUMMARY The increasing number of obese children <u>worldwide</u> will cause <u>serious</u> problems to medical services.

Reminder: The summary should be much shorter than the original – often only one or two sentences long.


