



EXPRESS THE CONDITIONAL MOOD

WOULD

is an auxiliary verb - a modal auxiliary verb.







WISH

We also use WOULD for other functions.








WOULD FOR THE PAST

We often use would as a kind of past tense of will or going to:



I thought it would rain so I brought my umbrella.










FUTURE IN THE PAST

When talking about the past we can use would to express something that has not happened at the time we are talking about:



In London, she saw the keyboard that she would buy one day.










FOR CONDITIONALS

We often use **would** to express the so-called second and third conditionals:

If I knew how to program, I would create an app.

Would you help me restore my Facebook password, please?












DESIRE OR INCLINATION



I would like to have a better laptop.










PAST HABIT

When I was younger, I would play a lot of video games.












OPINION



I would say that this film is really interesting.










PREFERENCE





What would you do if you could fly for one day?










If I were rich, I would travel around the world.

Used for talking about unreal situations.

SECOND CONDITIONAL

Present or in the future.











HOW WOULD I USE IT?

We can use it to talk about things in the future that are probably not going to be true. Maybe I'm imagining some dream.

For example:

If I won the lottery, I would buy a big house.

If my dad bought me a guitar, I would practice every day.

we can use it to talk about something in the present which is, impossible, because it's not true.

If I had his number, I would call him.

If I were you, I wouldn't use complex languages to program.

AFFIRMATIVE FORM

The position of the clauses can be inverted.

NEGATIVE FORM

If Sabrina studied harder, she wouldn't fail her English tests.



This app would be more interesting if it did not cost too much.











INTERROGATIVE FORM

Would you tell me the truth if I gave you one dollar?

Yes, I would / No, I wouldn't

Where would you go if you won the lottery?

If I won the lottery, I would go to Australia









WAS OR WERE?

We can use were instead of was for (I,HE,SHE,IT)

This is mostly done in formal writing

If I were you, I would use the mask all the time ✓

This file would upload faster if it was lighter ✓





The subjunctive mood is the verb form used to explore a hypothetical situation.

Demands

Verbs: wish, suggest, demand.

Wishes










WHAT IS SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD?

INDICATIVE MOOD


Facts and opinions.



That code is really useful.

IMPERATIVE MOOD

Giving orders and instructions.



Look at this useful code.

SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD

Expressing wishes, proposals, suggestions, or imagined situations.



I wish I could find a useful code.







WHAT IS SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD?

The **past subjunctive*** is formed with the past form of a verb that describes a state, condition, or habit. It is used to talk about hypothetical or imaginary situations. With the verb **be**, the form **were** (not **was**) is usually used for all subjects.

Use	Examples
After the verb <i>wish</i> to express an unfulfilled desire	I wish Sally were here to help us. He wishes he could run faster.
After <i>if (only)</i> in second conditional sentences (followed by a clause with <i>would</i> , <i>could</i> , or <i>might</i>)	If people drove smaller cars, we would all breathe cleaner air. If I were taller, I could reach the top shelf. You might like her if you knew her better.
After the verbs <i>suppose</i> and <i>imagine</i> , expressing unreal conditions (usually followed by a sentence with <i>would</i> or <i>could</i>)	Suppose you met the president. What would you say? Imagine you were rich. What could you do?
After <i>as though</i> or <i>as if</i> to make a comparison to an imaginary condition	She acts as though she were very rich, but she's not. He drives as if he were in a Formula 1 race.

^{*} The term "past" refers to the form of the subjunctive verb (past simple) rather than the time in which the action happens. All of the examples above are about the present.





SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD





If it were me, I'd go.

(As this explores a hypothetical situation, was becomes were.)


I wish it were real.

(As this expresses a wish, was becomes were.)

It is imperative that the game **begin** at once. (As this expresses a demand, begins becomes begin.)

I propose he work full time.

(As this expresses a suggestion, works becomes work.)
