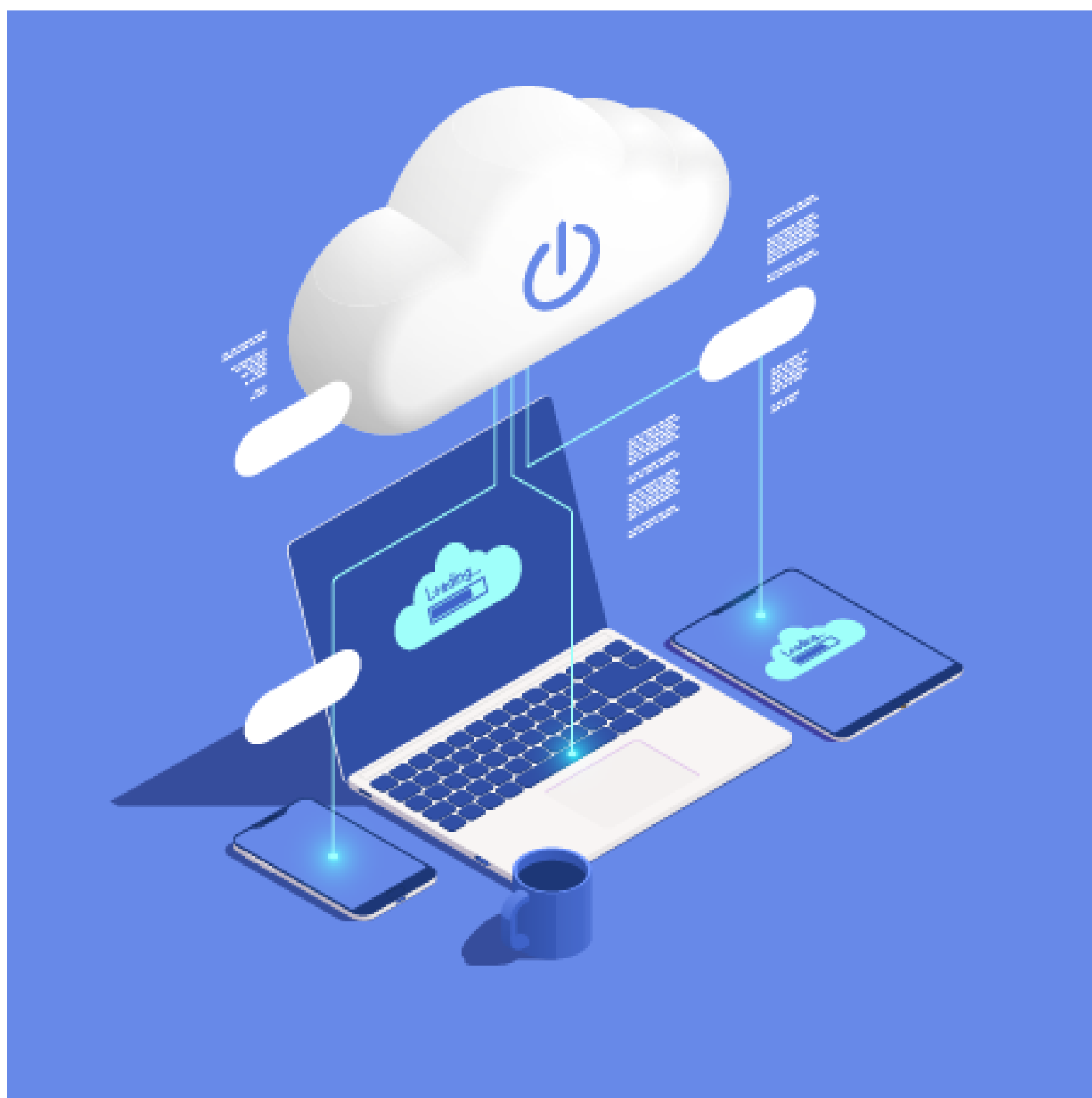

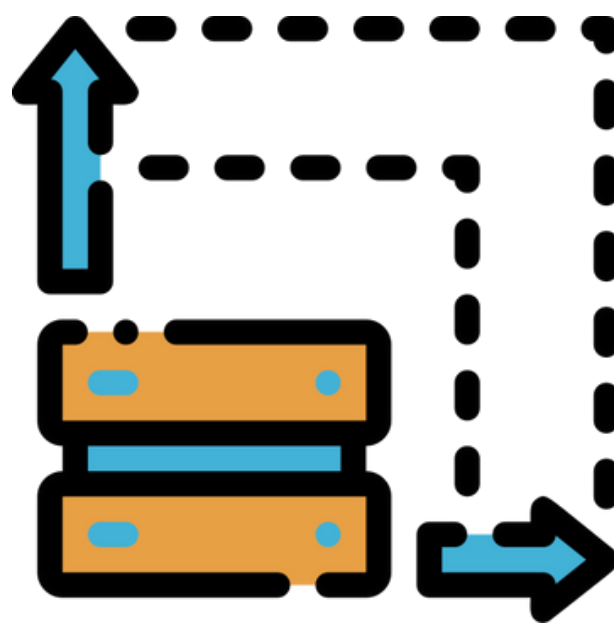

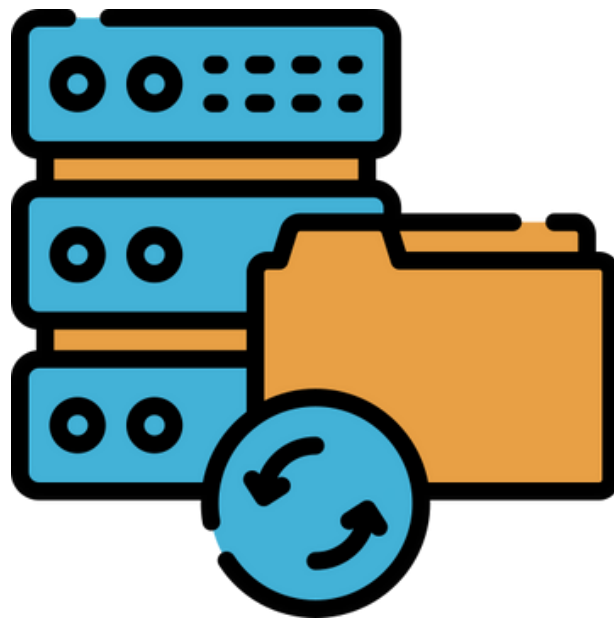


The IT requirements of every business are diverse. For instance, a multinational tech enterprise with thousands of employees requires more diverse resources than a newly started company with four to five employees.

Automated backups and disaster recovery



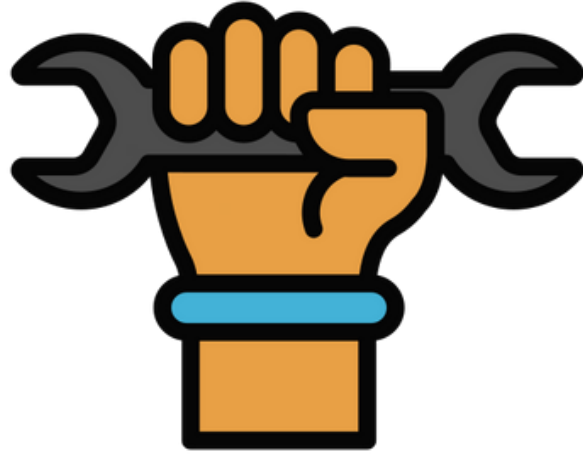

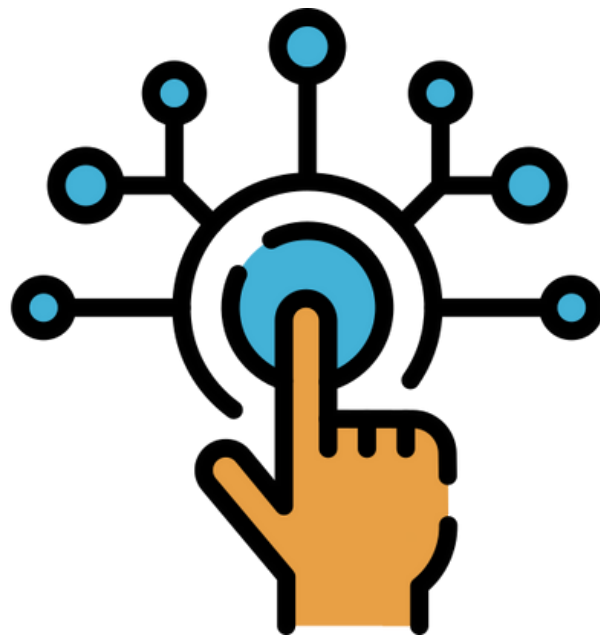
