Skimming includes reading the introduction and conclusion to understand the overall purpose and key takeaways.



Headings and Subheadings

Skimmers pay attention to titles, headings, and subheadings to understand the organization of the text. This helps in identifying major sections and topics.



Graphics and Visuals

Examining charts, graphs, images, and captions can offer insights into the main points or support the textual information.
